




Barred Instrument Dust Covers

- 1. Cut pattern to size
- 2. Sew together on 4 corners. Surge seam.
- 3. Use double-fold bias tape around the entire bottom edge of panels.
- 4. Thread elastic through the bias tape- use a safety pin, or a threader.
- 5. Tie a knot in the end, melt the end of the elastic tape and tie it in a knot.








Accidental Bar Pouches

- 1. Bar Pouches:
- 2. Cut patterns to size- three pieces.
- 3. Sew the velcro on the pouch. It is standard to put the female velcro on the inside, and the male velcro on the outside.
- 4. Punch the holes and put the eyelets or two piece grommets for the string into the pouch. Put pretty side of eyelets on to the outside. This will prevent damage to the wood.
- 5. Create a gusset on angle (45 degrees) of the bottom corners. This will create a flat bottom for the sides of the pouch.
- 6. Sew the sides onto the larger piece of the pouch. Tuck and roll as you sew them together. You can clip the pointed edge of the gusseted corner off so it's not as bulky.
- 7. Do the opposite side the same way.
- 8. Put bias tape around the edges of the exposed cut pieces to prevent fraying and sew the bias tape onto the pouch.
- 9. Thread the string through the eyelets to hold the pouch onto the end of the instrument.




